## INTRODUCTION



HAF activities are running from 20th December 2025 to 3rd January 2026

There is a huge range of fun activities and family events on offer, so take a look through this brochure to see what we have in store! Please also read the information below carefully for information on eligibility and the booking process.

### What is HAF?

Dudley Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme is a government-funded programme offering free activities and meals during the school holidays, primarily for school-aged children from Reception to Year 11 (inclusive) who receive benefits related Free School Meals.

### The Booking Process

- Bookings open on Monday 24th November 2025
- You must be registered on the Dudley HAF website to be able to book activities. If you haven't already registered, please sign up on the <u>Dudley HAF Website</u>.
- Once FSM status has been verified, you will receive an email with login details and a password for your account.
- · If you are already registered, you do NOT need to register again just log in to your account
- · When bookings open, you can log in and book sessions for your children.
- For the winter holidays, each eligible child can book up to 4 fully funded places.
