Headteacher's Introduction

We are very pleased to confirm that the heating issues have now been fully resolved and that the school has returned to normal operation. We understand the disruption this has caused and are grateful for the patience and understanding shown by our whole community. We have also been informed that the National Grid will be upgrading the local sub-station in the coming weeks. This improvement should ensure that, in the unlikely event of a similar situation in the future, the use of portable heaters will not result in a power failure.

It is a relief to once again focus all of our efforts fully on the teaching and learning of the young people of Ellowes. I am personally very proud of the exemplary way in which our students have conducted themselves throughout this period. Their maturity and resilience have been commendable. I would also like to extend my sincere thanks to all staff, particularly our dedicated site team, who worked tirelessly — even during the early hours of the morning — to keep us informed and to address issues as they arose.

I appreciated the opportunity to speak with several parents on Tuesday after school, who shared their concerns and constructive suggestions regarding how the recent power and heating difficulties were managed. We have reflected carefully and feel that we have learned a great deal from the experience, which will strengthen our response in the future.

My thanks also go to the staff who provided additional Year 11 intervention sessions throughout the evenings this week. Their commitment to ensuring that students remain supported in the lead-up to examinations is greatly valued. Well done to the many Year 11 students who attended these sessions online and demonstrated such dedication to their studies.

Year 8 students have also completed a demanding week of examinations. They approached this challenge with notable resilience, navigating a wide range of papers across almost all subjects. We thank both students and staff for their hard work and careful preparation. The next examination period will see further Year 11 mock examinations, followed later in the year by assessments for Years 9 and 7.

As you read through this newsletter, you will find much to celebrate: competition winners, students acting as responsible members of the community, charitable initiatives, examples of creativity, a wide range of extra-curricular opportunities, and our first ever Silent Disco — an event enjoyed as much by staff as by students. It was particularly heartening to see students so eager to return to school to take part in such events.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere thanks to all parents and carers for your continued support, understanding and partnership. Your encouragement and cooperation are invaluable and play a vital role in ensuring that our students remain safe, supported and able to thrive.

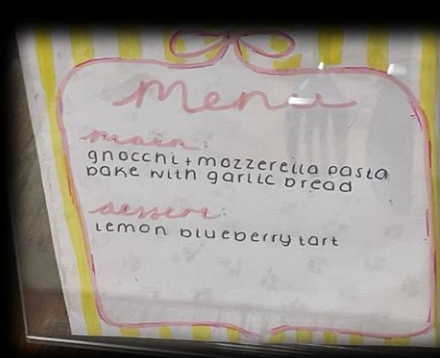

How to log into Sparx to complete homework from home

Weekly homework will be set on the following days and then due on the same day the following week.

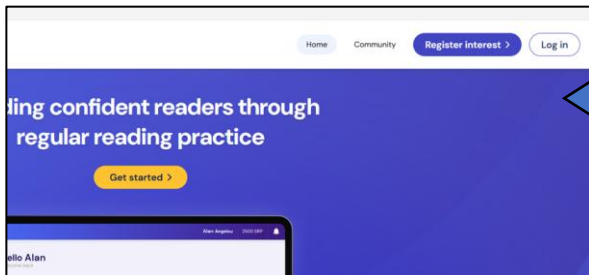
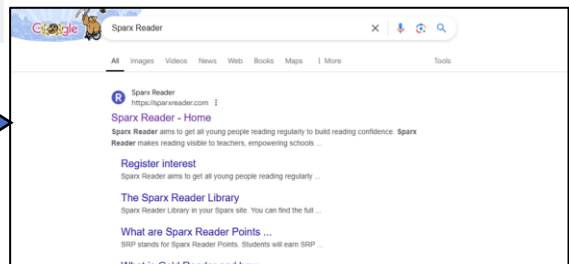
- Monday: Sparx Science

Students can log into Sparx through either [the link on their Arbor page](#) or through a search engine such as Google.

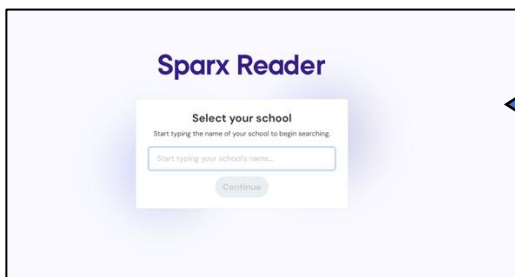

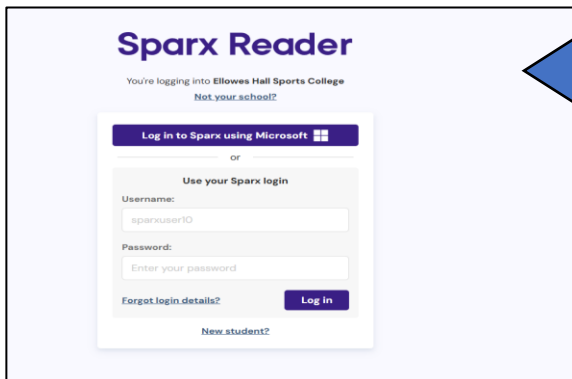
If accessing via Google, students will need to type Sparx Science/ Sparx Maths/ Sparx Reader into Google and select the first search result that appears.



Once they have clicked on either the link on Arbor or the search result on Google they need to click the white log in icon in the top right corner and then select student log in.



They will then be asked to select their school, which will appear as they start typing in Ellowes Hall Sports College



They can then click the purple box that says 'log in to Sparx using Microsoft' and then use their school email and password to log in. Their password is the same password that they use to log into any computer in school.

Any homework students have been set will appear. Students can continue to read on Sparx Reader even after their homework has been completed, and we would encourage them to, especially if they are really enjoying the book they have chosen.

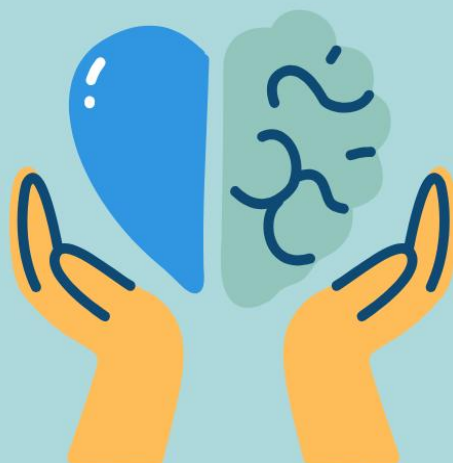

What is the group about?

- To help young people understand the cycle of worry, become familiar with CBT and establish goals.
- Learn about anxiety and how this can be managed.
- To understand how worrying can affect us.
- To be able to identify and manage the different types of worry.
- To learn and embed evidence based CBT strategies for when we feel worried.
- Provide relaxation, distraction activities and problem solving techniques.
- Provide staying well session and therapeutic ending.

2. Once referral has been discussed and submitted, an assessment will be arranged, parents will be contacted.
3. All assessments will take place outside school at Routes Cranstoun (Merry Hill)
4. Once an assessment has been completed and deemed suitable - group details will be shared.
