### Headteacher's Introduction

I would like to begin by commending our students for the resilience and maturity they have shown during the ongoing issues with the heating system in the main school building this week. They have approached the situation with a calm and positive attitude, and we are very proud of them.

While our Humanities Building, X Block and Sports Hall all operate on separate heating systems and continue to function as normal, we understand how important it is that all learning spaces are warm and comfortable. Although initial investigations suggested this might be a quick fix, engineers on site today have confirmed that repairs are likely to take place over the next few weeks.

Please be reassured that we have acted quickly to support our students and staff. Over the last couple of days, we have invested in portable heaters and placed them into classrooms where needed. We will continue to closely monitor temperatures and will order additional heaters over the coming days if required. The wellbeing and safety of our school community remains our absolute priority.

Naturally, we do not consider closing the school lightly, as we know how important continuity of

learning is for our students. Closing would always be a last resort. We are hopeful that the measures we have put in place will ensure the school remains warm while repair work continues, and we will of course keep this under regular review.

Beyond these challenges, it has been wonderful to see so many positives across the school this week. We were delighted to welcome students from Wombourne to our first Student-Led Panel Debate, focusing on social media and fake news which is a particularly timely and relevant topic given current global discussions.

The conduct of our Year 10 students during their mock examinations was exemplary, and I would also like to thank all parents who attended the Year 11 Parents Evening. It was fantastic to see so many of you there, and we truly value the shared commitment we have in supporting our young people to achieve their very best.

Looking ahead, we will be celebrating Teaching and Learning next week, including International Education Day on 24 January. This is an important opportunity to reflect on the power of education and the achievements of our school community.

# Sparx

## Parent/Carer Guide

### How to log into Sparx to complete homework from home

Weekly homework will be set on the following days and then due on the same day the following week.

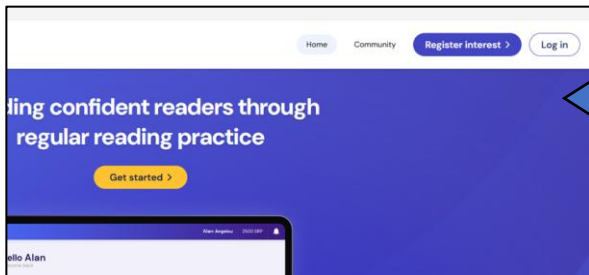
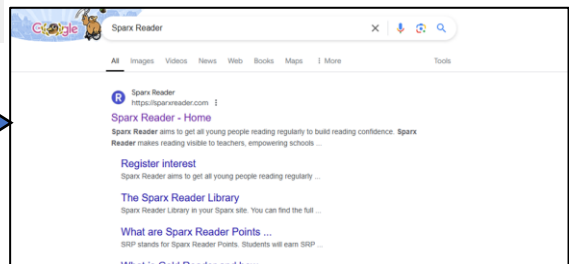
- Monday: Sparx Science
- Wednesday: Sparx Maths
- Thursday: Sparx Reader

Students can log into Sparx through either [the link on their Arbor page](#) or through a search engine such as Google.

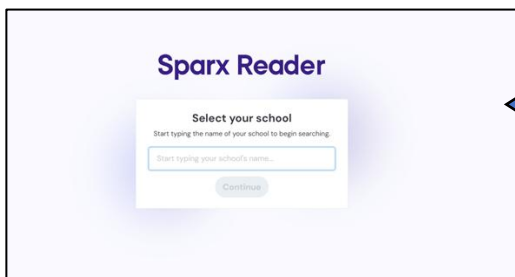

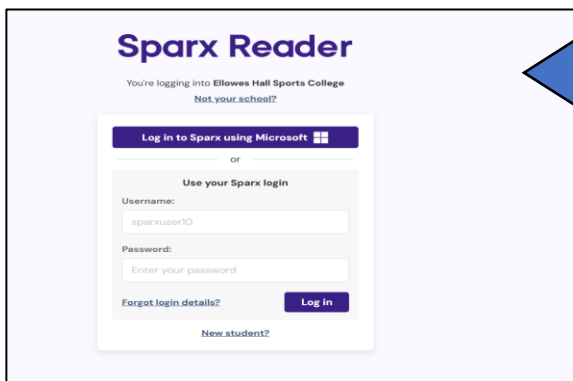
If accessing via Google, students will need to type Sparx Science/ Sparx Maths/ Sparx Reader into Google and select the first search result that appears.



Once they have clicked on either the link on Arbor or the search result on Google they need to click the white log in icon in the top right corner and then select student log in.



They will then be asked to select their school, which will appear as they start typing in Ellowes Hall Sports College



They can then click the purple box that says 'log in to Sparx using Microsoft' and then use their school email and password to log in. Their password is the same password that they use to log into any computer in school.

Any homework students have been set will appear. Students can continue to read on Sparx Reader even after their homework has been completed, and we would encourage them to, especially if they are really enjoying the book they have chosen.
