### Headteacher's Introduction

I would like to begin by once again thanking everyone for their resilience and patience during what has been a frustrating and unsettled time for our school community. Following the failure of two industrial-sized generators in less than a week — circumstances entirely beyond our control — we have taken the decision to move to online learning for students in Years 7–10 on Monday 2nd February. Face-to-face lessons will continue for Year 11, based in H Block and X Block.

Please be assured that we are doing everything possible to resolve the situation and will continue to work tirelessly with all relevant parties until the school is fully operational once again. The safety, wellbeing, and continuity of learning for our students remain our absolute priorities.

Despite these challenges, school life has continued in many positive and meaningful ways. A wide range of extra-curricular activities has taken place, including visits such as the Iceland Trip, the Poetry Live event at Symphony Hall, and the Alexandra Theatre trip to see *The Woman in Black*. In addition,

students have benefited from a workshop delivered by the Beacon Centre, highlighting the support available for people experiencing sight loss. Some of our RE students have also represented the school superbly at the Dudley RE Debate. We have also recently heard from the school in Uganda that we support, sharing how the equipment generously donated by our students is already making a real difference.

These moments are a powerful reminder of the strength, adaptability, and spirit of our school community. Even in challenging circumstances, our students continue to learn, contribute, and represent the school with pride.

Finally, I would like to thank parents and carers for your continued support, understanding, and partnership. Your patience and encouragement mean a great deal, and together we will continue to navigate this situation with resilience, optimism, and a shared commitment to our students.



On Thursday 29th January, GCSE Drama students from Year 10 & 11 and a selection of Year 9 students travelled to Birmingham to see a performance of The Woman in Black to develop their critical thinking skills, exploring both acting skills and technical elements such as lighting, sound and costume to support and develop a wider appreciation of Drama production from page to stage and the multitude of careers that are available in the industry all while preparing them for upcoming exams. They represented the school excellently and the Performing Arts Faculty are incredibly proud of them.





Year 11 students visited Birmingham Symphony Hall on Monday to listen to a variety of the poets they study for their GCSE Literature course. They gained some insightful thoughts and heard a range of poems being performed, as well as gaining advice off a chief examiner. Highlights were local lass, Sedgley born poet, Liz Berry. Whilst not one of the GCSE poets we study, she talked about how we all should be proud of our accents and dialects reading some of her work in her wonderful Black Country accent - a powerful message to all. # Sparx

## Parent/Carer Guide

### How to log into Sparx to complete homework from home

Weekly homework will be set on the following days and then due on the same day the following week.



- Monday: Sparx Science

Students can log into Sparx through either [the link on their Arbor page](#) or through a search engine such as Google.




If accessing via Google, students will need to type Sparx Science/ Sparx Maths/ Sparx Reader into Google and select the first search result that appears.



Once they have clicked on either the link on Arbor or the search result on Google they need to click the white log in icon in the top right corner and then select student log in.



They will then be asked to select their school, which will appear as they start typing in Ellowes Hall Sports College



They can then click the purple box that says 'log in to Sparx using Microsoft' and then use their school email and password to log in. Their password is the same password that they use to log into any computer in school.

Any homework students have been set will appear. Students can continue to read on Sparx Reader even after their homework has been completed, and we would encourage them to, especially if they are really enjoying the book they have chosen.


